Autumn Term 1

Topic Theme: Rivers

English Class Text- Trash

We read Trash, which is set in 'an unknown developing city'. This tear-jerking novel will leave the children wondering what is going to happen next. It is about some young boys who live on a dumpsite. One lucky, or unlucky, day they make a find which reveals an extraordinary discovery. This book will help children understand how different other children's lives are to their own. Linked to the text, we will write balanced arguments and newspaper reports. In grammar, the children will focus on the different word classes, the active and passive voice and subordinating and coordinating conjunctions.

PSHE – Me and My Relationships (Y6)

This half term we explore assertiveness, and cooperation in our relationships. In order to do this, we cultivate negotiation and compromise through activities and discussion. We discuss safe/unsafe touches and explain what appropriate and inappropriate touch is and give examples.

Maths

Year 5:

Place Value: We will focus on working with numbers up to 10, 000, 000. We will compare numbers along with rounding them to the any integer. We will also work with negative numbers.

Addition and Subtraction: We will focus on adding and subtracting numbers with more than 4 digits.

Year 6

Place Value: We will focus on working with numbers up to 10, 000, 000. We will compare numbers along with rounding them to the any integer. We will also work with negative numbers.

Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division: We will add and subtract, learn about common factors and multiples and squared and cubed numbers. We will also multiply 4 digit and 2 digit numbers and learn long multiplication. We will also learn about the order of operations.

Science

We study how the fossil record and the work of Mary Anning helped Darwin develop his theory of evolution and inheritance. In simple terms we look at how offspring inherit some characteristics from each parent but are not identical to either of them. We revise the water cycle and its importance to the creation of rivers.

Geography

We study rivers and river systems, learning how they shape the landscape and their importance to humans. We revise UK geography and consolidate our knowledge of the key countries, cities, mountain ranges and rivers. symbols

RE- Inspirational people

We look at inspirational figures from modern times and think about how their faith has driven their desire to change the world. Pupils reflect on what drives people to make positive changes for the people of the world.

PE

We work on our Tag Rugby Skills and improve our fitness through multiskills routines.

Computing

We develop our understanding of E-Safety. We learn how to be responsible when using the internet and the affects of what we share online.

French

We upskill our knowledge of French phonics to help us improve our pronunciation.
