



Class 3 Curriculum Map (Cycle A)

Spring Term 2

Topic Theme: It's all about the Greeks!

English:

We will continue reading our class novel Gorilla Dawn. We will find out the outcome for the Gorilla, the girl and the tribe. We will write a newspaper report, a persuasive text and an information text about The Congo. We will focus on fronted adverbials, active / passive voice and modal verbs, along with formal language appropriate for these texts. Within our newspaper writing, we will explore making shifts in levels of formality.

Rights and Respect (Y6)

Pupils identify, discuss and write about a current wellbeing issue in the media. They look at biased reporting and learn to think critically about information. They consider what it means to be a discerning consumer and the influences that they are exposed to that might make update required before

Maths

Year 5: Perimeter and Area: We will work on finding the perimeter and area of shapes.

Decimals and Percentages: We will work with decimals up to 3 dp and look at equivalent fractions and decimals. We will order, compare and round fractions and begin to understand percentages.

Statistics: We will learn to interpret and draw line graphs and tables.

Year 6: Fractions, decimals and percentages: We will work on ordering fractions, decimals and percentages. We will also work on missing values and 2-step percentage problems

Area, perimeter and volume: We will work on finding the area of triangles and parallelograms along with finding the volume of cuboids.

Statistics: We will work on interpreting line graphs, bar charts and pie charts. We will draw bar charts and learn how to work out the mean of a set of data.

Science

We look further into adaptation and the interrelated nature of animals and plants in a habitat. We investigate food chains and webs and learn about producers, consumers and decomposers. We consider how living things are classified and why this classification helps our understanding of life on earth.

Music

We prepare musical performances for our Easter service, combining instruments and voices. Pupils learn to play their part within a group performance controlling tempo and dynamic.

Computing

We develop our skills in excel learning how to create formulas, draw graphs and present information. We format cells and sheets to make them easier to use.

RE- World Views, family and community

We will explore what contributions religion has to local life. We will explore how we can make our local area tolerant and respectful.

PE

Pupils further develop their gymnastics skills, learn about effective teamwork and communication skills and apply these to outdoor adventurous activity group work.

History

In History, we will study the time period of The Ancient Greeks. We will place them on a timeline and discover their significance to History. We will explore a range of evidence to draw our own conclusions about The Ancient Greeks.
